International Telecommunications Traffic and Revenue Report

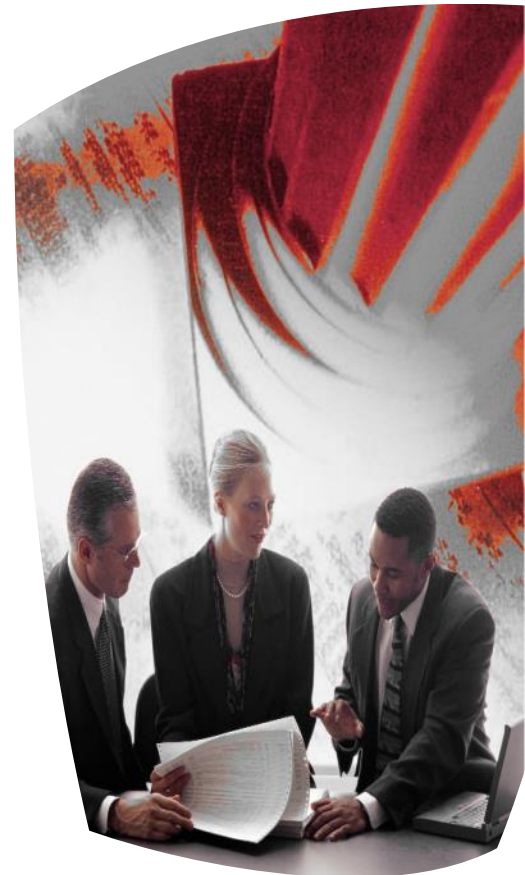
The Annual International Telecommunications Traffic and Revenue Report is due on or before July 31, 2016. As was started last year, all filers are required to use the online filing system. Common carriers that provided any international telecommunications service in 2015, including carriers providing resale service transported by an underlying carrier, are required to file an International Traffic and Revenue Report according to Section 43.62 of the FCC rules.

Generally, if your company bills customers for international calls in your own name, then you are an international reseller and must file the traffic report. However, if other carriers bill your customers for all of their international communications, then you are not classified as an international reseller and you should not have to file the report.

Common carriers that provided international resale service with less than \$5 million in revenues during 2014 will only have to complete a limited portion of the total online filing—the “Services Checklist.” In essence, the Service Checklist (attached to this Special Bulletin) replaces the transmittal letters filed in the past that established the carrier is not subject to full international traffic reporting. In addition, the Service Checklist provides an overview of which of the four schedules will be required to be completed.
