North American Numbering Plan Reporting

Two semi-annual filings relating to the North American Numbering Plan are coming up soon: (1) CIC access and usage report, and (2) Form 502 numbering resource utilization/forecast report (Form 502)

CIC Access and Usage Report

The semi-annual Carrier Identification Code (CIC) access and usage report is due to the North American Numbering Plan Administration (NANPA) by February 1, 2016 using data as of December 31, 2015. This report is required of all carriers and affiliates who have been assigned a CIC by NANPA. Carriers that have not been assigned any CICs may disregard the filing.

Attached is the Alliance for Telecommunications Industry Solutions (ATIS) CIC reporting guideline that outlines the reporting requirements. NANPA contact and filing information is on page two. For carriers that have been assigned CICs, we recommend timely filing of the report before the February 1, 2016 deadline, as well as ensuring all pertinent contact information is up to date in NANPA's records. Failure to file could result in an effort by NANPA to reclaim assigned codes.

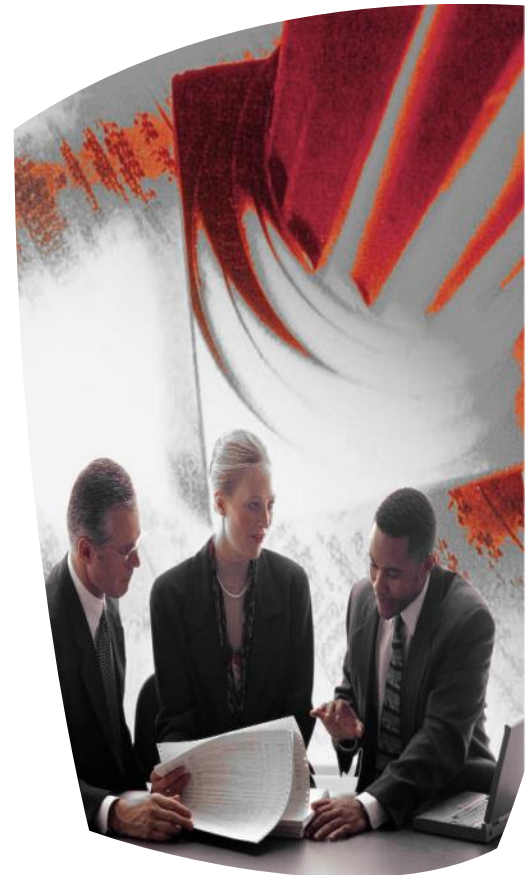
Form 502 (Numbering Resource Utilization/Forecast)

The semi-annual Numbering Resource Utilization/Forecast Report (NRUF) filing (Form 502) is due to the North American Numbering Plan Administration (NANPA) by February 1, 2016 using data for the six month reporting period ending December 31, 2015. This report is required by providers utilizing telephone numbers assigned by NANPA
